01 EDGEMONT SCHOOL UPDATE


There is exciting work underway for the public K-9 Edgemont School – we now have a planned school opening date of September 2027! The following are the key messages from the City of Edmonton regarding the school.

The City of Edmonton continues to work with Brookfield to complete the assembly of the Edgemont school/community park. While portions of the park are within City ownership, the majority of the site has not yet been transferred to the City of Edmonton. Ongoing work to complete assembly should not impact the development of either school or park.

A few major points around the progress:

- City Council approved the rezoning of the future park site to Public Park (AP) in October 2022.
- Subdivision approvals are in place
 which includes the dedication of municipal reserve to complete the assembly of the Edgemont
 school/community park.
- Brookfield continues to drive and advance related development in the Edgemont neighborhood, including: roadway fronting the future site and required servicing connection for the school and community league site. Yay!
- The City of Edmonton has prioritized Edgemont school/community park as a capital development priority.
- Provincial funding for the design and construction has been approved.
- City Administration will bring forward a budget request in November to secure funding for planning and design work, with a subsequent request for development funding to occur at a later date.
- Once funding is approved, planning and design work will start in Q1 2024! This will be a collaborative effort between public engagement and direct stakeholder engagement with the Edgemont Community Leage and Edmonton Public School Board, which will also inform future park programming.
- City Administration is working to ensure that park development is complete in advance of the September 2027 school opening.

Overall, we are headed in the right direction with progress towards a school for our community!







02 SNOWBANK RINK 2023



We heard our community loud and clear! The rink was an amazing and welcome winter amenity in our community last year and we are really looking to be able to continue to offer this again for the 2023-2024 season. We are starting the planning and fundraising efforts for the Edgemont Snowbank Rink. With that, we are also looking for short-term Community Rink Lead for the season.

The rink is a significant expense for our League, at a cost of approximately \$17,000, which is more than our yearly operating grant from the City of Edmonton. To be able to reserve some funds for other programming and events throughout the year, we are currently seeking community partners to sponsor our snowbank rink again this year. The Community League board members are actively working to secure partnered funding for the rink, and we could use your help and support also if you know of any businesses that would provide

sponsorship.

Once we have the funding, we can start the process to develop the rink. A local company will build and maintain the rink with hay bales and lighting overhead (like last year), and community volunteers will help with other aspects of the site (shovelling snow, turning lights on/off, etc.).


04 CANADA DAY BBQ FOLLOW-UP
